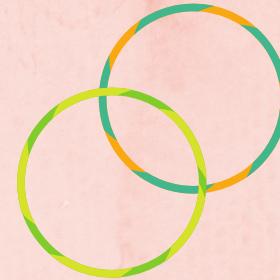


Team Spirit Award
