

Stage 2 – Monitor When attendance falls below 91%	 Formal letter sent home with attendance certificate informing parent/carer of current attendance percentage and next steps.
Stage 3-Listen and Understand When attendance falls below 80%	 Formal letter sent home with Individual Attendance Plan for parents/carers to agree and sign.

Stage 4-Facilitate Support When attendance falls below 70% Formal letter from the Multi Academy Trust sent home inviting parents/carers into school for attendance meeting with headteacher.

All families to be sent a termly attendance letter and

 Early Help Assessment advised and referral made to Child and Family Wellbeing Service.

Stage 5-Formalise Support/Enforce Possible Penalty Notice or Prosecution If no improvement or engagement after Stage 4, school will refer to the Local Authority for possible legal interventions.

*The trigger for legal intervention is 10 sessions (the equivalent of 5 days) of unauthorised absence in a term, or 14 sessions (the equivalent of 7 days) of unauthorised absence across 2 consecutive terms (LCC 2024)

Legal interventions for school non-attendance include:

Penalty notice

Parents may be issued with a penalty notice as an alternative to prosecution. If they pay the fine, they can discharge liability for the offence of failing to ensure their child's regular attendance at school.

Prosecution

Parents may be prosecuted in the Magistrates' Court and receive a fine, a community order or be imprisoned.


Parenting Order

If a parent is convicted for failing to ensure their child's regular attendance at school, a Parenting Order may also be applied for. This may require them to attend parenting classes and may specify other relevant directions for the parent.

Education Supervision Order

An application for an Education Supervision Order may be made, which appoints a local authority supervisor for the family and requires the parent and/or child to follow their directions.

^{*} For cases meeting the 14-session trigger, due to constraints in court evidential periods, absences should be aggregated across two consecutive terms – e.g. Autumn half-term 2 and Spring half-term 1.
