Super Sports Day

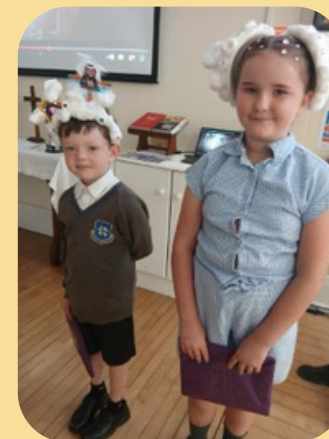

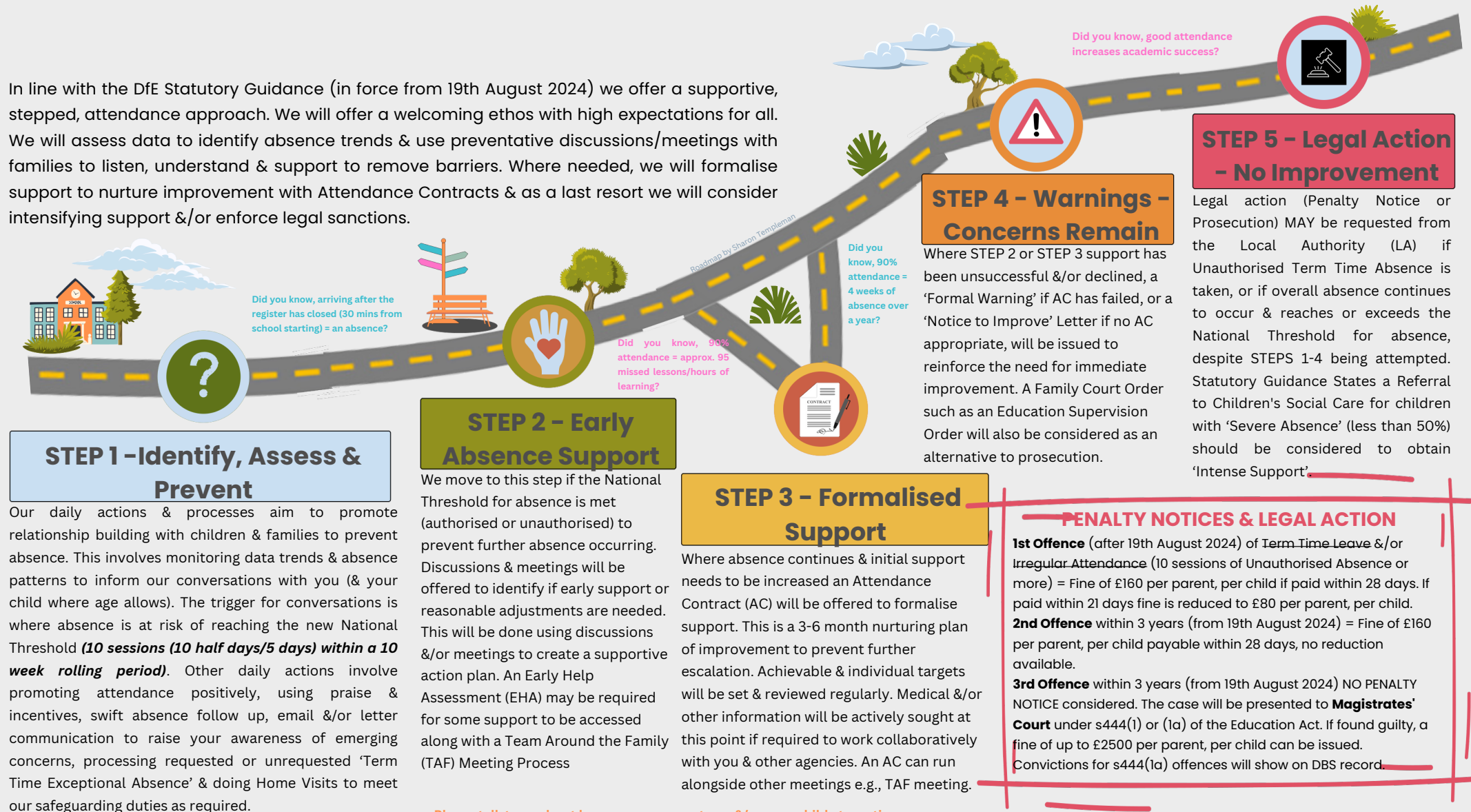
