

### Playground Whistle Routine

You may have noticed that we now use two whistles in the morning. This change has been introduced to improve health, safety, and behaviour at the end of break times and also applies to the morning drop-off.

On the first whistle, children must stand still; on the second whistle, they should walk to their lines. We appreciate your support with this routine, particularly if you remain on the playground after the gates open at 8:30am.

### Communications to school

At St Joseph's, we always strive to keep your children safe, happy, learning, and feeling valued. While we welcome feedback, both positive and negative, aggression or unacceptable behaviour towards staff will not be tolerated.

At St Joseph's, we operate an open-door policy and welcome direct communication. We ask that any issues are raised with your child's class teacher, in the first instance, so communications can be addressed appropriately. ### Times Table Rockstars

Times tables are a key building block for maths. When children know times tables well, they can work more quickly and confidently and find units of work much easier.

5–10 minutes of daily practice can make a big difference in building fluency and confidence. Please support us in encouraging your child to practice their times tables. Year 4 have a multiplication check in June.




